

AGRICULTURAL LITERACY IMPACT

Michigan Agriculture in the Classroom impacted 31,576 students and 6,431 teachers in 1,536 Michigan schools in 2023 through the following programs.

FARM Science Lab



Two 40-foot mobile classrooms, equipped with teaching technologies, tooled with STEM-based lessons and aligned with science and agricultural literacy standards.





AGRICULTURAL LEADERSHIP IMPACT

Michigan Foundation for Agriculture programs delivered leadership development opportunities to 758 members and young leaders from 61 county Farm Bureaus in 2023.

High School and Collegiate



Building skills for career readiness, leadership opportunities and advocacy for agriculture.

- 150 students from 26 counties competed in six regional High School Discussion Meets.
- 6 Collegiate Farm Bureau members from our 13 collegiate chapters competed in the Collegiate Discussion Meet.
- 797 pails were distributed to high school students through county Farm Bureau efforts.
- 20 FFA chapters and Collegiate Farm Bureau members shared consumer messages through #SpeakAgMichigan.

Promotion & Education



Preparing agriculture leaders to be the active voice for agriculture while educating consumers about our industry.

- 230 members attended the Voice of Agriculture Conference, learning about consumer outreach, business and leadership development.
- **6 new county P&E leaders** completed a six-month leadership development webinar series.
- 10 innovative county P&E projects were showcased at State Annual Meeting.
- 15 State Committee members participated in leadership development modules throughout the year.

Developing 18-35-year-old agriculture leaders for service in their county Farm Bureaus and communities.


IMPACT BY THE NUMBERS

- **95 young farmers** competed in District Discussion Meets.
- 46 young farmers from 30 counties submitted award applications.
- 231 members attended Young Farmer Leaders Conference.
- 17 young farmers graduated from ProFILE.
- 29 county committee chairs participated in our Chair Summit.
