# **2024** Priorities

- **Growing our Young Farmer (18-35-year-old) program** by recruiting 10 new young farmers to attend programs and get involved within the county farm bureau.
- Advocating on behalf of agriculture with legislators: Each year, we host an ice cream social event where we invite state and local legislators to meet and discuss policy with our members.
- **Combatting childhood hunger:** In total last year, we raised \$1,944 to assist community members at the Southern Michigan Food Bank which in total supplied about 10,692 meals!
